# Zoom Instructions for 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday Launch Meeting Wednesday, September 9th

#### Before the meeting:

 You will need a computer or tablet, that is connected to the internet, or smartphone with speaker or headphones. You will have the opportunity to check your audio immediately upon joining a meeting.
 Over email you will receive an invitation for the meeting from a member (the Host). The notification will include a **link** to "**Join via computer**" as well as phone numbers for a conference call option. It will also include the 9-digit (usually) Meeting ID.

#### To join the meeting:

- 1. At the start time of your meeting, click on the link in your invitation in your email to **join via computer**. You <u>may be instructed to download the Zoom application</u>.
- 2. You have an opportunity to test your audio at this point by clicking on "Test Computer Audio."
- 3. Once you are satisfied that your audio works, click on "Join audio by computer."

You may also join a meeting without clicking on the invitation link by going to join.zoom.us on any browser and entering the Meeting ID provided by your host.

If you are having trouble hearing the meeting, you can join via telephone while remaining on the video conference:

- On your phone, dial the teleconferencing number provided in your invitation.
- Enter the Meeting ID number (provided in your invitation) when prompted, using your touch-tone keypad.

#### Participant controls are in the lower left corner of the Zoom screen:

Using the icons in the lower left corner of the Zoom screen, you can:

- Mute/Unmute your microphone (far left)
- Turn on/off camera ("Start/Stop Video")
- View Participant list opens a pop-out screen that includes a "Raise Hand" icon that you may use to raise a virtual hand
- Somewhere on your Zoom screen you will also see a choice to toggle between "speaker" and "gallery" view. "Speaker view" shows the active speaker. "Gallery view" tiles all of the meeting participants.

# WHO INVENTED THE Caller ID and call-waiting?

Inventor: Shirley Ann Jackson

# Year / period: 1970's

- Shirley Ann Jackson was an award-winning theoretical physicist. Her contributions to the field of telecommunications led to the invention of numerous technologies, including caller ID and call-waiting, as well as solar cells and fiber optic cables.
- 1. She is (as of 2017) the president of the prestigious Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. She's also the highest paid president of a private college.
- 2. She is a theoretical physicist and held senior leadership positions in academia, government, industry, and research.
- 3. She has a B.S. in Physics and a Ph.D. in Theoretical Elementary Particle Physics, both from MIT.
- 4. She is the first African American woman to receive a doctorate from MIT, and the first African American woman to serve as president at a top-ranked research university.
- 5. Her invention of the technology responsible for Caller ID and Call Waiting stems from days at AT&T Bell Labs where she conducted research in theoretical physics, solid state and quantum physics, and optical physics.
- 6. She has been awarded 53 honorary doctoral degrees.
- 7. She was awarded the National Medal of Science, the nation's highest honor for contributions in science and engineering by President Obama in 2015.
