#### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - JUNE 2021



As I write this last bulletin message to you as president, I am reflecting on all the changes we have been through together during the last four years. My first article in September 2017 was primarily about the book sale and how important your participation was to fund our scholarships and other mission-based activities.

We no longer are hosting a book sale. This was determined by the Covid outbreak, but the prospect of continuing was not very enthusiastic even before the outbreak. As you know we did raise the necessary funds through our 100<sup>th</sup> year celebration fund raiser last fall. We have had many changes this year – no luncheons, no in-person study groups or meetings. A lot of organizations have had significant difficulties continuing the last 14 months. I am happy to say that we not only came through this whole, but also, I believe, even better.

One thing about accepting a role as president of a group of over 200 women is to consider the vast amount of talent among our members. No one of us can do it all. We have people who are terrific writers, have technology skills to help us all, are especially good at arranging venues and luncheons and organizing work crews when necessary.

Consider our in-person luncheon that occurred on May 12<sup>th</sup> at the Beverly Park Pavilion. One of our members researched and reserved the location, another researched and ordered the luncheons and covered the tables and brought centerpieces, others took reservations, another made certain that we had a sound system, and another made certain that we had flowers for our previous leaders. Many people helped set up and clean up. No one person was responsible for it all. Sixty plus members attended and I heard only praise and gratitude for this event. One person told me it was the first time she had been out with people in a long time and how appreciative she was that we had this opportunity. (See pictures on page 1.)

One other thing I would mention is our members' willingness to learn new skills when they are needed. Our members are lifelong learners. We support education and opportunities for women, and we model the behavior that we advocate for all. In other words, we are not done yet – we are still here, and we are still able to try to improve the lives of all women and girls including ourselves.

Another activity we have had this year was the "Virtual Happy Hours" organized by our Membership Vice President Katie Wiese. These were fun events and gave those members who participated a chance to catch up with other members and to show off their hats on national hat day, green outfits on Saint Patrick's Day, and you get the idea. It's always nice to learn something new about you.

I also want to give a special thanks to the branch board for their work during these years and for their very thoughtful gift of a \$600 donation to AAUW Funds in my honor. This has been a remarkable board – their unselfish efforts have helped us move our mission forward and strengthened the branch.

As I look forward, I am so pleased to be able to turn this office over to Jean Ivory. Under her leadership we will continue to evolve and expand our program to achieve our mission.

My last message is a big Thank You to all of you – whether you served on a board, attended virtual meetings, checked up on other members, supported us financially – all of these things are valued. I thank you once more.

## <u>AAUW Scholarships and Grants – How It Began</u>



## AAUW has a proud heritage of helping women pursue higher education, tracing back to a time when few women had that opportunity.

It started after the U.S. Civil War. With a growing middle class and more women looking to go to university, AAUW founder Marion Talbot gave the call to support a fund for women's graduate education. She and Fellowships chair Christine Ladd Franklin asked all members to contribute \$1 per year. The goal was "to enable gifted women to use their intellectual powers for the good of humanity."




As a result, in 1888, the very first fellowship went to Ida Street, a pioneer in the field of early American Indian history, in the amount of \$350.

**Ida Street** 

In 1920, AAUW identified a groundbreaking scientist they wanted to support: Madame Marie

Curie. Members helped raise funds to purchase a gram of radium for Curie to use in her research at a cost of \$100,000.

By the 1950s, AAUW had funded more than 1,100 women in over 40 countries. In 1963, AAUW expanded its fellowship and grant program. In collaboration with the U.S. Department of State, it developed the African Educators' Program, which brought African teachers from newly independent African nations to America to study in U.S. colleges.



In the 1970's, AAUW created research and project grants that allow women to return to school, to re-enter the workforce, and to give them the skills they need to be competitive in the workplace.

As we entered the new millennium, AAUW awarded \$4 million in fellowships and grants for the first time.
