COMMITTEE TO VISIT OAKLAND COUNTY SCHOOL BOARDS

LOOKING FOR VOLUNTEERS

The Public Policy study group has established a committee to develop a plan to observe monthly Oakland County school board meetings. The concern is certain school boards have members that are sympathetic to Moms for Liberty that supports banning books, curriculum and materials they find unAmerican.

AAUW members will be asked to volunteer to watch board meetings monthly via YouTube making in-person visits unnecessary. The League of Women Voters has a similar project in place so we can share impressions. There are 28 school districts in Oakland County and they all have televised meetings. Between the LWV and AAUW Birmingham members we may be able to cover most of them.

If you are willing to observe a school board meeting, please let me know and you will be contacted regarding an assignment and procedures.

PUBLIC POLICY GROUP

This is an announcement and invitation to our members from the Public Policy Group.



The presentation will be on September 14th at 2:30 via **ZOOM**. All members and friends are welcome to join us.

- ♦ Kinder, gentler political campaigns?
- More issue-based conversations, less name calling?
- Less extreme (right or left) candidates winning the primary?
- More consensus?
- These could happen if we had Ranked Choice Voting!

In Ranked Choice Voting (RCV), voters rank candidates by preference on their ballot, marking their first, second and third choice for each office. If a candidate wins an outright majority of first-preference votes, she will be

declared the winner. But if no candidate wins a majority of first choice votes, the first-preference votes is eliminated. The second and third choice preferences of those who voted for



the failed candidate are then

distributed to the remaining candidates. A new tally is made to determine whether any candidate has now won a majority of the adjusted voters. This process is repeated until a candidate wins a majority of votes cast.

Ranked Choice Voting is used in Alaska & Maine (for both federal and state elections) and in Hawaii for certain elections. In 15 states, some localities use RCV in municipal elections. In Michigan, RCV has been implemented in Eastpointe, adopted in Ferndale and under consideration in Royal Oak. Five states have banned use of RCV in statewide and local elections.

Our presenter will be Ron Zimmerman, a member of the Board of Directors of Rank MI Vote, an advocacy

group promoting ranked choice voting in the state of Michigan. RankMiVote.org.

Michigan's Women's EQUALITY DAY Celebration

Local AAUW branches were joined by many area organizations such as League of Women Voters, NAACP, Women's Native American Organization, ERA, Coalition of Labor Union Women/Metro Detroit, International Federation of Business Professional Women, International League for Peace and Freedom/Metro Detroit, Michigan ACE Women's Network; NOW; Women's Zonta International and

National Council of Jewish Women.

Laura Callow provided some historical background and an update on the Equal Rights Amendment. Laura has dedicated much of her life to working for women's civil rights. She helped form Michigan **ERAmerica**

coalition and was the voice for various aspects of the ERA on 'Point of View' on WJR radio in Detroit from 1977-1986. Among her achievements and awards, Laura was named Susan B. Anthony Award from U-M Dearborn in 2008.



Meghan Kissell AAUW National

Meghan Kissell came from Washington, DC to talk about what she does as the Public Policy Chair for AAUW National and Senior Director, Policy, and Member Advocacy.

Communications strategy and grassroots organizing are two of her areas of expertise. Meghan also spoke

of the importance of pushing for ERA legislation.

Although the amendment has passed, it has not been confirmed by both houses. She stated that until that's done, the amendment is vulnerable to change as evidenced by recent controversies in many states.

Laurie Pohutsky was the keynote speaker. She is the Michigan House of Representative for the 17th District and is Speaker Pro Tempore serving her third term.

Ms. Pohutsky has a BS degree in microbiology from Michigan State University. She shared her strong support for environmental issues, paying attention to the confirmation of the ERA amendment.
